## **Election Season is in Full Swing**

Election season kicks into top gear with fast-approaching voting dates of August 28, October 2 and November 2. As candidates try to draw voters' attention, the L WVNO Voter Service committee strives to assure that non-partisan candidates' information is readily available to the public. The *L WVNO Internet Election Guide* contains the unedited candidates' biographical information and their answers to specific League-crafted questions. The Voters Service Committee drafted relevant questions for each office. The League has reached out to all candidates, and after data submission, the public can view the Guide on [www.lwvno.org/](http://www.lwvno.org/). Links to the candidate information for the August 28 election will be available on August 9 and the release date for the October 2 election is September 7. The Voters' Guide provides a valuable service, reaching tens of thousands of voters each election. In the fall of 2008, the site was accessed over 81,000 times during the campaign period.

The L WVNO website is a wealth of election information. Composed by Linda Walker and posted by Ann Pettit, the site provides citizens with accurate, detailed information including early voting places, facts about voter registration, and a careful description of who can vote in which elections. Voter Service is currently seeking volunteers — a voter registration coordinator to guide voter registration outreach, and a volunteer to train for copying and pasting candidate information into the website. We thank both Patty Andrews who previously chaired voter registration and Stacy LaFleur, who helped with posting. Also, workers are needed to collect poll results on election nights.
